Kimberley Public Library now offers help from real, live tutors right at the library via the Internet!

Live Homework Help is available for Kindergarten – 12th grade, college introduction level students, and adult learners 2:00-9:00 pm, 7 days a week. This program connects students to a real live tutor. Children and young adults simply log on to the Kimberley Public Library website they will find the live tutor link, enter their library card number, their grade level and the subject they need help in and within a few minutes or less are connected to an expert tutor. Students can receive help in math, science, social studies or English.

The tutoring service is free of charge to users.
